Title : Financial Aid to the deserving students.

Objectives :

Many students of our college are coming from rural areas with low economic background. Most of their parents depend on Agriculture, which is still backward in the district. Hence the objectives of this practice are.

- To extend financial aid to the poor students to avoid the discontinuation of their study.
- To remote equality among the students
- To create “Sense of social responsibility” among the students.

Context : It was decided to extend the benefit to the poor students and it is implementing in the college with the context of

- Many students need financial support for admission fees, examination fees etc.
- Most of them are deserving candidates who need help due to their financial backwardness.
- Identifying the interested public doners and staff to help the deserving students.

The Practice :

The college is situated in rural area where there were frequent droughts and famines. But the poor parents ambitious to send their children for higher education. Hence this practice is intended to help them with the meagre resources available.

Implementation of the Best practice in the College:

Our College has taken a firm resolve to extend financial support to the deserving students and help them to continue their education. The financial support is extended to the deserving poor students without any discrimination of caste and creed.

The principal and admission committee of our college has been decided to provide admission fee for some deserving students by the available sources. The voluntary donors and teachers help are taken for the financial assistance for meritorious and poor students.

Drawing inspiration from institutions legacy, they are paying the tuition fee and admission fee to the regular and industrious students who are unable to pay the fees owing to poverty.

Evidence of Success :

As per adopting this practice Principal is decided to provide deserving candidates and selected a student Kum. Meghashree P, seeking admission for I B.Sc. She is a poor student who don't have financial source to pay the admission fee, because she lost her father. She got distinction in II PUC with 92% of marks. She has been appealed to the principal for the financial support. College principal had approached Sri Srinath, Proprietor, Shri Vishnu Granites, Honnahalli, Chamarajanagar district for the help to this student. Sri Shrinath has been paid of Rs. 8150/- as admission fees.

Now Kum. Meghashree P is continuing her education in B.Sc (PCM) course. She got a better result in both first and second semesters, obtained 7.72 and 8.28 GPA respectively.

This practice has a positive impact on the academic abilities and attitudinal changes among the beneficiaries. The review results of the aid indicate that the humble assistance enables the poor students to acquire Bachelor Degree.

Best Practice - 2

Title of the Practice : Women Empowerment

Discrimination against women even in 21st century is a serious matter which concerned on 'gender inequality'. Rural areas are destroyed by miserable conditions of serious poverty, illiteracy, ill health and superstition. Majority of our students belong to the weaker sections including SC, ST, other backward classes and minorities who don't have proper education, health and productive resources. Even in this condition the poor and tradition bound parents admit their daughters to the college. We cannot neglect our students to be the victims of discrimination exploitation and segregation, because they are the most valuable resources. Hence the college supports them to empower to face the life boldly, successfully for the peace, harmony and dignity.

Objectives of the Practice:

The College has resolved to take up the cause of women empowerment with the following objectives..,

- ✓ Monitoring students on women specific issues for every class.
- ✓ Creating awareness to enable the students to realize their full potential for learning and solving their problems independently.
- ✓ Arranging special sessions with the police and social activists to be aware of exploitation and to protect their private life confidently.
- ✓ Conducting seminars and special lecture programmes to enlighten the students on human rights and fundamental freedom for equal rights, ragging and dowry system.
- ✓ Organizing the exclusive health camps to create awareness on women related health problems like sanitation, personal hygiene, seasonal disease, HIV / Aid etc.,

The Context :

- ✓ In the beginning, the students were not enthusiastic to participate in these programmes.
- ✓ This practice was not supportive by the parents and teachers in the beginning.

- ✓ The gender sensitization programme designed several disparities and inequality which would destroy society.
- ✓ Some students and parents found fault in these unconnected and counterproductive programmes.

In this context, the college has thought to implement these programmes effectively.

The Practice :

To achieve the aim of Women Empowerment, the college has been tagged the programmes to Anti Ragging and Anti women harassment cell and Red Ribbon club.

These cells have been conduct awareness sessions during leisure hours sensitizing the girls to know their status in the college and society. The cells are also organized various awareness programmes / seminars / workshops and interactive sessions for the empowerment of women. It aims to prevent the social evils like eve-teasing, ragging and dowry system, providing necessary counselling and guidance by the professional women counsellors, professional physiologists and psychiatrists.

The latest among them is a special lecture programme on 'Aids awareness' organized on 14.03.2019.

Dr. Asha, co-ordinator, ICTC, District Hospital, Chamarajanagar explained in detail regarding the origin and growth of Aids in her inaugural address. She told that Aids was detected for the first time in America and later during 2002 in Karnataka. It was a serious issue earlier, but it is decreasing in these years due to the Aids awareness programmes. National Aids Control Organisation is striving hard to bring it to zero by 2030. Unsafe sexual activities are the main cause for Aids. She advised the young girl students not to be attracted towards sex.

Dr. Asha clarified the students doubt about the safe sexual activities, causation of Aids and its diffusion, prevention, curation and safety measures.

On account of special lecture programme, free health camp was conducted in the beginning. More than 150 students became the beneficiaries.

Evidence of Success :

Most of our college students were inspired by these programmes to avoid their negative feelings, inequality and shyness. These cells have taken a responsible and sympathetic view of the girls.

Problem encountered of the practice :

- ✓ Most of our students are still in shyness talking about Aids and HIV and its diffusion, safe sex activities etc.
- ✓ Ensuring the support and participation of women teachers in the programmes is a tough task.
- ✓ Women students involve in the matter of love in adolescent age is scarifying the class work.
- ✓ Organizing various programmes during working hours, harm on class work.
- ✓ Implementation of the annual plan and its monitoring has become a tough task in view of tight academic schedule.
