## Preamble

### JSS MATH

The Community life in India is closely linked with spiritual and religious institutions for the past five thousand years. The religious leaders have been the guiding forces for upholding the moral values of life and in the progression of society as a whole. The glorious Sri Kshethra Suttur Math is a reflection testimony to enrich its tradition to make human values eternal.

Jagadguru Sri Veerasimhasana Mahasamsthana long history of more than one thousand years is a multidimensional institution has which contributed immensely to the cause of societal advancement. The welfare activities of the Sri Math transcend the sectarian limits of the Veershaiva community and encompass the much wider and larger following of all sections of Indian community.

The founding of the Math can be traced to a historical event linked with Sri Shivarathreeshwara Shivayogi Mahaswamiji crusading for peace between warring kingdoms. The hostility between Rachamalla IV of the Gangas of Talkad and Rajaraj of the Cholas was about to break up into a large scale war. It was due to the timely intervention of Sri Shivarathreewara Swamiji, the hostility ended and the enemies became friends. Then it was on the request of Rajaraja, his Holiness condescended to establish a matt on the banks of the Kapila river at Suttur, near Mysore.

The inscriptional evidences support the establishment of Suttur matt during the reign of Chola kingdom. The name of Shivaratri Shivacharya is mentioned in many ancient works such as Panditaradhya Charita, Shivacharya Chudamani and Gana Sahasranama. The tradition handed down from one pontiff to another indicates that the said Shivaratri Shivacharya is the founder of Suttur Math.

Sri Eshaneshwara Wodeyar, the 2nd pontiff was responsible for further development of the Suttur Sri Math during the times of Rajendra Chola. The Someswara temple near the Math at Suttur is said to have been constructed by the Chola kings, in accordance with the wishes of Sri Eshaneshwara Wodeyar. An inscription referring to this event is dated as 23<sup>rd</sup> October 1032. Today, Suttur Math is backed with the services of over 15,000 dedicated personnel working in the institutions managed by it. At any given point in time, over 50,000 students study in its educational institutions which range from kindergartens to

post-graduate technical and medical education institutions in both rural and urban centres. Nearly three lakh patients are treated in the hospitals and clinics run by the Sri Math every year while millions participate in the spiritual gatherings and cultural festivals organized periodically by the Math. Through, the various schemes of the agricultural research facilities made available, thousands of farmers are benefitted in the region. With its administrative head-quarters located at the foot of the picturesque Chamundi Hills, in the erstwhile Princely city of Mysore, Sri Suttur Veerasimhasana Mahasamsthana Math is today recognized as a major mission, and is drawing seekers of knowledge and wisdom in large numbers. The activities of the Math have drawn



accolades from various quarters from the layman to the head of states. Work is Worship the motto which guides the Math is enshrined in its emblem. “Selfless Service” is the spirit behind every task that the Sri Math undertakes and since the service is considered to be an offering to Lord Shiva, its purity and intention are of utmost importance. Sri Suttur Veerasimhasana Math has grown over the centuries to be a multidimensional, religious, cultural and educational movement. Spearheading the Math’s educational initiatives is Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeswara Mahavidyapeetha (JSSMVP), founded by the 23rd Pontiff, His Holiness Jagadguru Dr. Sri Shivarathri Rajendra Mahaswamiji. 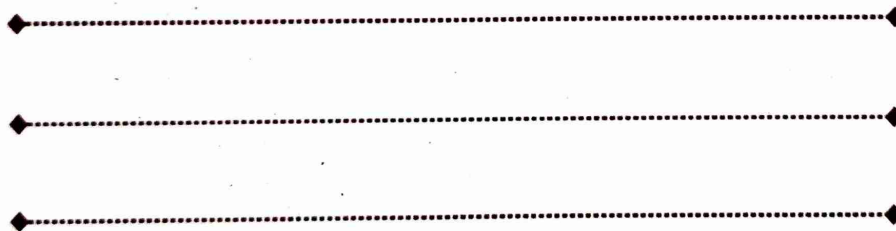

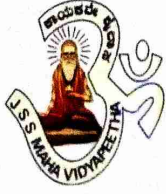

**Report on**  
**A One Day State Level Workshop on Research Methodology**

On June 8, 2023, a one day state-level workshop was organized on Research Methodology by the Department of Computer Science in association with Internal Quality Assurance Cell. Kum. Vedashree, II BCA, invoked the program and Mrs. Shubha L.N, Head of the Computer Science Department welcomed the gathering. The event was inaugurated and addressed by Prof. M. R. Gangadhar, Honourable Vice-Chancellor of Chamarajanagar University. He congratulated the college for organizing the event and emphasized the importance of such workshops in the present day.

Prof. M.R. Gangadhar spoke about being a social scientist, where society serves as a laboratory and highlighted the greater responsibility of scientists in such fields. He provided an example of how the tribal community living in two different regions is classified into two castes. Today, due to the lack of proper education and training, many problems arise. He mentioned that this kind of programs contribute by providing training and assistance to help address these issues.

Prof. M.R. Gangadhar emphasized that research conducted by experts' associations is a crucial aspect of societal advancement. He elucidated how research methodologies in the field of social science assist researchers and highlighted the major research models in social science. He provided an introduction to the principal research methodologies in social science and explained the process of research. He stressed that through research methodologies, scientists are able to address problems and contribute to societal progress. They help in reaching the root causes of issues and provide assistance for societal advancement.

Dr. V.N. Manjunath Aradhya, Professor and Head of the Department of Computer Applications, JSS Science and Technology University, Mysore, was the chief guest of the program. He spoke about the advancements and research breakthroughs in India in the past decade, how it has transformed the nation's path and how it has increased job opportunities, especially through the growth of startups.

Dr. B. Prabhuswamy, Assistant Professor, Department of PG Kannada, JSS College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Mysore, talked about research and study as a part of the current education policy. He expressed concerns about the inadequate implementation of research in our education system. He emphasized the need for a disciplined approach to learning through research. He also mentioned that researchers should possess a research-oriented mindset, curiosity, and enthusiasm. Every phenomenon has a cause and effect relationship and through exploration, the research mindset develops. He cited the example of Reverend George Ferdinand Kittel, who learned the Kannada language within three years of his arrival in Karnataka at the age of 18 and compiled a Kannada-English dictionary with 86,000 words, showcasing the achievement that can be attained through dedication, interest, curiosity and sincere effort. He encouraged everyone to become researchers and emphasized the importance of being proactive from the beginning.

The principal of the college, Mr. G. Siddaraju, in his presidential address, emphasized the importance of research in today's education system. Previously, only those who were interested would engage in research and it was not considered essential for education. However, with research

becoming an integral part of the education system, there is a strong need to actively participate in it. Research means seeking the truth repeatedly, searching for accurate facts and findings. To make any research successful, the collection of relevant data is crucial. He mentioned the discoveries made by Madam Marie Curie, Thomas Alva Edison, and Sir C V Raman, stating that their research has been beneficial to humanity. Their achievements were remarkable, even in the absence of many resources. We live in a society where all resources are available to us, and by utilizing them effectively and conducting research, we can contribute to the welfare of humanity.

Mrs. Revanamba B, the coordinator of the IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell), Mrs. Shubha L.N, Head, Department of Computer Science, were present on the stage. Ms. Pooja H V, Assistant professor, Department of Computer Science proposed vote of thanks. Mrs. Arunashree K.S, Head of the Mathematics Department outlined the program. Faculty members and research scholars from various colleges had attended the event.

### **Technical Session -1**

#### **Dr. V N Manjunath Aradhya**

Professor and Head

Department of Computer Applications

#### **Topic: Overview of Research and Its Importance.**

Dr. V N Manjunath Aradhya presented his paper on "Overview of Research and Its Importance". At the beginning of his presentation he gave definitions on research, motivation and objectives, importance of research and process of research.

He talked about Global Innovation Index (GII), that Switzerland ranks first among 131 economies featured in the GII 2020, Switzerland remains the world leader in innovation a 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. He justified about the need of innovations for job and economic growth and it is estimated that the world economy could double in size by 2050 due to technological improvements.

The resource person explained the difference between invention, discovery and innovation. He gave a detailed demonstration on Invention, which is creating something totally new with one's ideas and development. He described Discovery as - recognising something for the first time, that already exists and that nobody has found before. He explained the term innovation, as the people creating value by implementing new ideas.

Then he talked about required qualities for a good researcher. There are so many qualities required for a good researcher like commitment, quick thinker/ critical thinking, curiosity, intelligence, excellent written and verbal communication skills, staying calm, analytical mind and systematic approach. The researcher should desire to get a research degree along with its consequential benefits, desires to face the challenge in solving the unsolved problems, desire to get intellectual joy of doing some creative work, desire to be of service to society and desire to get respectability. He explained different kinds of research like one time research, longitudinal research, Diagnostic research, exploratory research, experimental research and historical research.

The resource person explained the procedure of research. The purpose and common concepts used in research should be clearly defined. The research procedure used should be described with sufficient details, to permit another researcher to repeat the research for further advancement, keeping the continuity of what has already been attained. The procedural design of the research should be carefully planned to yield results that are as objective as possible. The researcher should report with complete frankness, flaws in procedural design and estimate their effects upon the findings. The analysis of data should be sufficiently adequate to reveal its significance and the methods of analysis should be appropriate. The validity and reliability of the data should be checked carefully. Conclusion should be confined to those justified by the data of the Research and Limited to those for which the data provide inadequate basis. Greater confidence in research is warranted if the researcher is experienced, has a good reputation in research and is a person of integrity.

Finally, he described the problems encounter by researchers in India as lack of scientific training in the methodology of research, insufficient interaction, Information/ data obtained from a business unit may be misused etc. Research studies overlapping one another are undertaken. There is no code of conduct for researchers. Library management and functioning is not satisfactory at many places. There is also the difficulty of timely availability of published data from various Governments and other agencies.

### **Topic: Cultural Studies**

Dr. B. Prabhuswamy, Assistant Professor in the Department of PG Kannada, JSS Arts, Commerce and Science College, Mysuru spoke on the topic of "Sanskriti Adhyayana" (Cultural Studies) during the second Technical Convention of the Workshop. He emphasized that research is a methodology and that cultural studies require a distinct approach. There should be a cultural touch in both science and technology, and the development of technology is possible through research. This is crucial for human advancement. Culture refers to the way of life and understanding the values and practices of human life, which necessitates research. This is an interdisciplinary research endeavour.

The direction of research and its methodologies need to change. Scientific research should aim to enhance human life, but research is not progressing in the direction of improving human life. The social, economic and religious environment in which we live is our culture. We refer to the customs and traditions of indigenous communities as culture. Additionally, dance, music, drama, and other forms of art come under the purview of culture. The study of all these aspects is necessary. There are intersections between science and culture as well. In scientific and technological research, culture should be incorporated as an integral component.

Karnataka, being an integral part of India, is culturally enriched. The British were the ones who initiated cultural studies in India. Colonel Mackenzie, a Mathematician, surveyor and administrator, was appointed as an official during the Fourth Anglo-Mysore War in 1799 when Tipu Sultan died,

leading to the British rule in Mysore. During his tenure, he travelled 40,000 miles and extensively studied the culture of Karnataka, collecting 1,799 inscriptions. Sir Walter Elliot established a Kannada school in Dharwad and collected 800-900 inscriptions in North Karnataka. These eminent personalities deciphered and documented the Kannada culture, preserving its essence. Our culture is fascinating and holds allure. Through study, we can truly understand the intricacies of our customs and traditions. Culture is an inseparable part of life, and it is our duty to promote and nurture it. Reconstruction can only be achieved through study. In this regard, it is essential to undertake cultural studies.

### Valedictory Ceremony

During the valedictory ceremony of the workshop, Ms. K. Vedashree, II BCA student, offered prayer. The welcome address was delivered by Ms. P.S. Manasa, Assistant Professor in the Department of Computer Science.

Professor P. Madesh, the Registrar (evaluation) of Chamrajanagar University, delivered the valedictory speech, highlighting the rapid growth of research in recent days. He mentioned that there are two types of research in this field. The first one is exploring new research, and the second one involves examining previous research. Exploring new research involves taking a step from darkness towards light, while examining previous research aims to uncover what is unknown to the world. In research, when questions arise, it signifies the excellence of that research.

In research work, it is crucial to properly select the problem or issue at the beginning. When conducting a regional survey, one obtains literary information about the region, then collects data, and subsequently analyzes the collected data. Finally, the research report is prepared. Research is a new exploration, and any subject that is understood can be easily researched. They emphasized that the research you, as research students, undertake should follow these guidelines, whether we observe it or not.

Mr. G. Siddaraju, the principal of the college, delivered the presidential address with great enthusiasm, highlighting his deep interest and involvement in research. He emphasized that learning itself becomes challenging and requires effort when undertaking any task. However, it also provides immense satisfaction. By selecting the subject, understanding its purpose and significance, research endeavours can be successful. It was noted that you, as research students, have gained knowledge of various topics complementing research through this event, and they expressed the hope that it will be beneficial for you in the future.

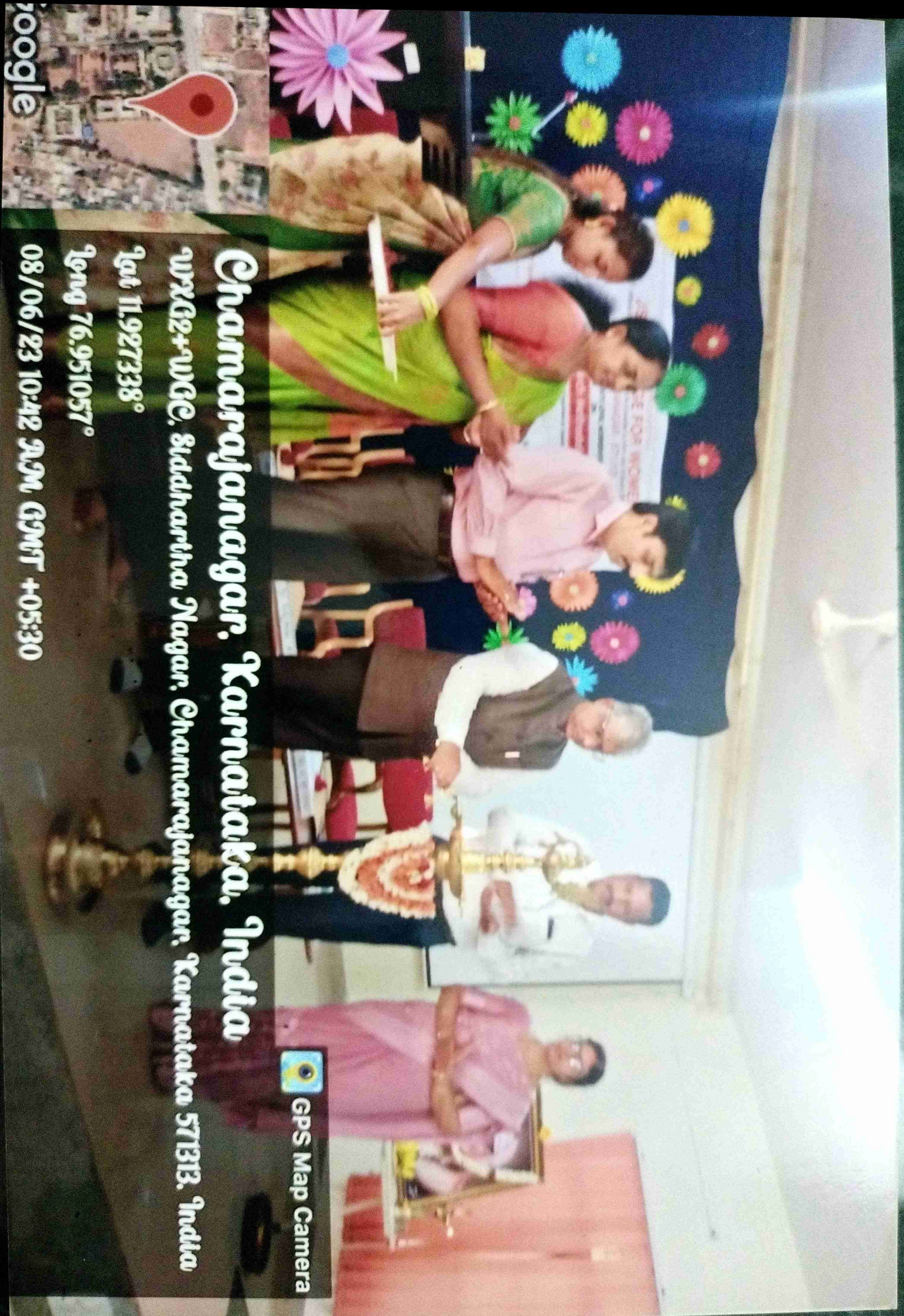

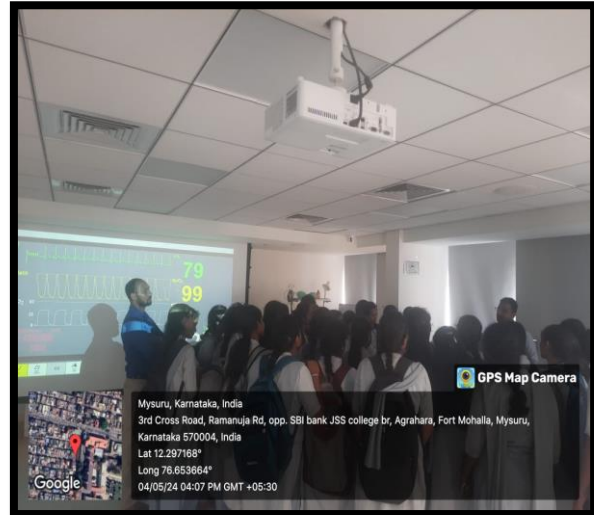

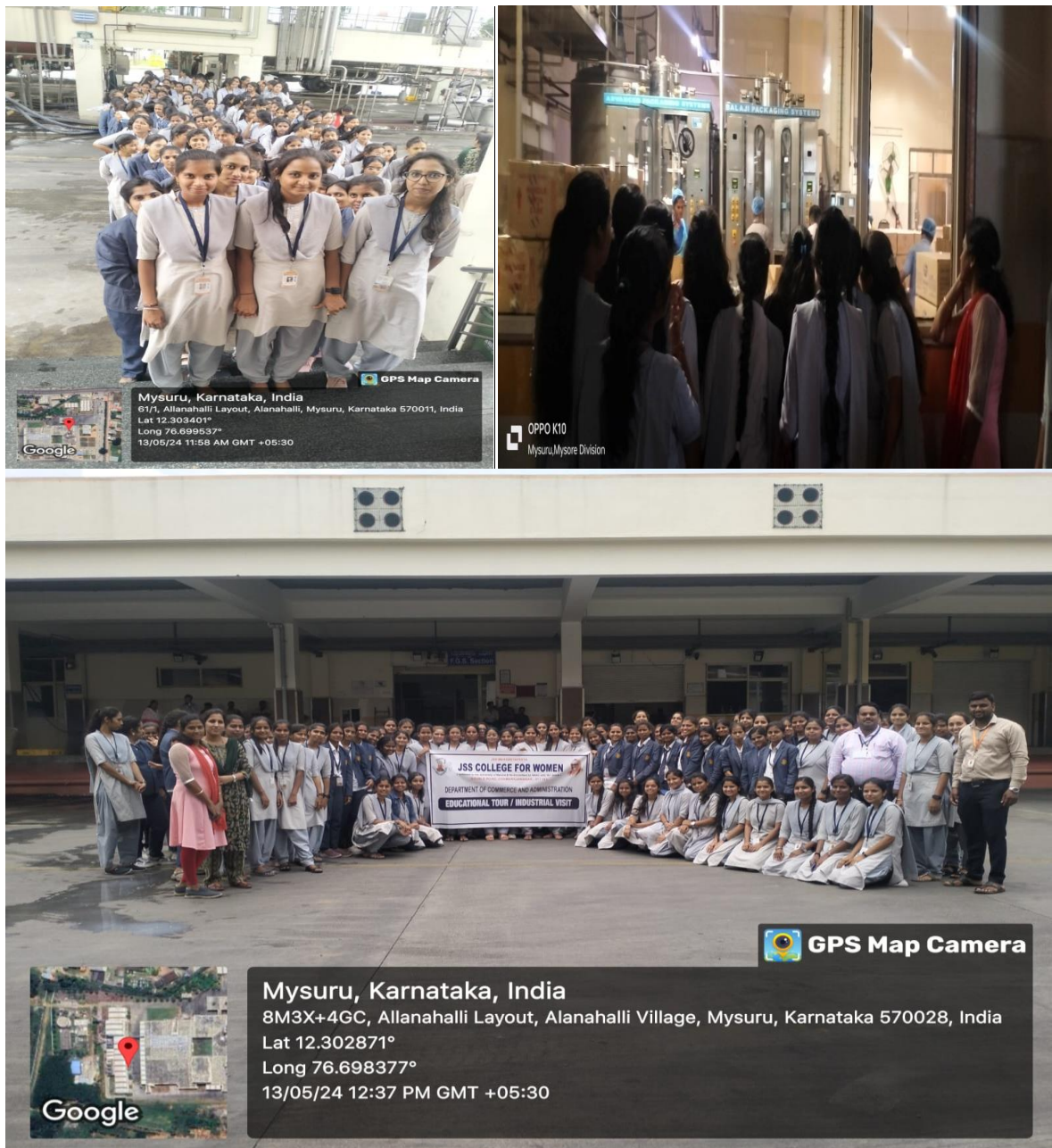
A complete report on industrial visit organized by Department of Commerce and Administration for B.Com and BBA Final year students in order to get the practical knowledge.

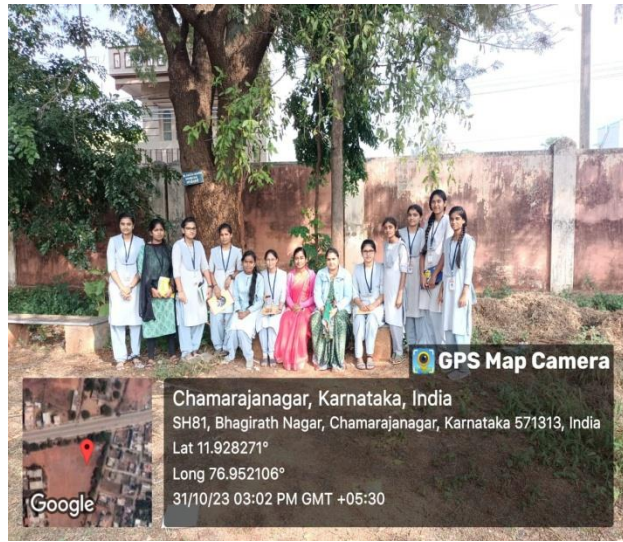
# Zoology department
